ENDORSEMENT

- [1] A Case Management Conference was held in Vancouver, British Columbia on July 18, 2012 at 9 A.M. Pacific Standard Time.
- [2] The parties agree that the claim is valid and to proceed to a hearing restricted to the issue of damages and the adequacy of compensation.
- [3] With respect to the jurisdictional issue raised by the Respondent, Counsel for the Claimant informed the Tribunal that the claim will be advanced solely on the basis of damages that are pecuniary in nature and that all other claims for non-pecuniary damages will be abandoned.
- [4] The parties agree that the Province of British Columbia should not be provided with a Section 22 *SCTA* Notice.
- [5] Paragraph 7 of the Response will be amended on consent in accordance with the request of Counsel for the Respondent.
- [6] The parties agree to provide a common book of documents and an agreed statement of facts by no later than **September 10, 2012**.

[7] Counsel for the Respondent will obtain instructions respecting,

- a. Disclosure of trust account documents
- b. The retention of a joint expert
- c. The retention of Mr. Gordon Frampton as an expert

and report to Claimant's Counsel and the Tribunal no later than **September 10, 2012.**

[8] The potential need for the retention of additional experts will be discussed at the next Case Management Conference.

[9] A Case Management Conference will be scheduled for **September 25, 2012 at 10 A.M.** Pacific Standard Time via video conference.
