



SPECIFIC CLAIMS SNAPSHOT

Specific claims deal with the past grievances of First Nations relating to outstanding obligations under historic treaties. Settling these past grievances through negotiations is key to achieving reconciliation and rebuilding relationships with First Nation people in Canada.
