ENDORSEMENT

Honourable Harry Slade, Chairperson

A Case Management Conference (CMC) was held by teleconference on October 1, 2014, at 1:30 P.M., Eastern Time (Ottawa).

[1] The Claimant shall provide the Respondent with their draft list of documents on or before November 3, 2014.

[2] The Claimant shall provide a list of the names of elders who shall provide oral history evidence, Will-Say Statements in respect of the same, and a list of potential translators to the Respondent on or before November 14, 2014.

[3] The Oral History Hearing shall be tentatively scheduled for January 14 and 15, 2015, pending Counsel's availability.

[4] The Claimant shall provide the Respondent with a non-binding précis, to the extent possible, of the areas they anticipate their experts to address in their Expert Reports for the purposes of facilitation the Respondent's inquiry on the identification and availability of experts to be retained for the purposes of response Expert Reports. The Claimant anticipates that their Expert Reports will be filed no later than mid-March.

[5] The Parties shall discuss between themselves the question of bifurcation considering the issue raised by the Tribunal, and the Claimant's proposal.

[6] The next CMC shall be heard in person in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan the afternoon of November 12, 2014, or the morning of November 13, 2014. The Registry shall contact the Parties for their preferred time. The Parties shall be prepared to discuss, *inter alia*, the following:

- a) timelines for proceedings in where the claim is bifurcated, and timelines for proceedings where the claim is not bifurcated;
- b) the Respondent's progression on its list of documents;
- c) dates for document production, Expert Reports and timing of proceedings; and,
- d) the logistics of holding the oral history evidence hearing in the community.
